Recent Projects

- THE GOODING DISTRICT HAS BEEN AN ADVOCATE OF THE BRAILSFORD DITCH PROJECT IN HAGERMAN. THE BRAILSFORD DITCH EXPERIENCED A FAILURE IN THE SUMMER OF 2013 CAUSING SEVERE BANK AND FIELD EROSION THAT RUNS PARALLEL TO THE ROAD. THIS CAUSED GULLYING EROSION DEPOSITING SEDIMENT INTO RILEY CREEK AND THE STATE FISH HATCHERY. NRCS DESIGNED A PROJECT FOR WATER TRANSPORT WITHOUT ANY COSTSHARE INVOLVEMENT THAT WAS ESTIMATED TO BE \$25,000.00; THE TOTAL PROJECT ESTIMATES EXCEED \$100,000.00.
