
HOW DISTRICT MATCH FUND ALLOCATIONS ARE CALCULATED—GRAPHICAL EXPLANATION

For this example, assume:

- Idaho has only 4, rather than 50 Conservation Districts.
- Each of the 4 Districts received some local support, and the sum of the local support received by all 4 Districts was \$10,000, thus the size of the Local Support Pie is \$10,000.
- The State has \$100,000 available to be divided between and distributed to the 4 Districts as match, thus, the size of the Available Match Pie is \$100,000.

The Local Support Pie for these 4 Districts might look like the pie on the left, below, where each District received some local support, and the sum of the local support received by all 4 Districts was \$10,000.

How big a slice of the Available Match Funds pie each District is entitled to is determined by dividing the Available Match Funds pie into slices that are proportional to the slices that make up the Local Support Pie. So, if you are District 1, you accounted for 10% of the local support that went into the Local Support Pie, so your match allocation will be 10% of the Available Match Funds Pie!
