FY 2023 CONSERVATION DISTRICT FUNDING REQUESTS

The Commission is required by Idaho Code, §22-2727, to hold an annual conservation district budget hearing. At the hearing you are to consider the financial needs of the Districts and use this information as the basis for your request for state funds for distribution to conservation Districts. Traditionally, the Board reviews unmet district funding needs for projects to inform our budget requests. In accordance with statute, Districts have been invited to provide input on their funding needs.

As of June 6th, no Districts have submitted written budget requests for your consideration. However, this should not be taken as a sign that Districts do not have financial needs. Districts work hard to overcome the challenges of the increasing costs associated with keeping their doors open and Districts all around the State could no doubt put additional funds to good use.

All Districts received notice of this hearing and have been invited to speak about their financial needs. Staff recommend that time be provided for any District who would like to provide their budgetary needs, comments or concerns to do so.

OPEN POSITIONS UPDATE

Engineer

Ricki Garden has joined our staff as an Associate Engineer in Division 5. Her first day was June 6th in Boise where she worked with Crystal getting onboarded. Ricki has a strong background in riparian restoration and work experience with the US Forest Service as well as a soil conservation District. We are very excited to have her aboard. Office logistics are still being worked out.

Division 3 NRC

Interviews for this position will be held June 9th. I will provide you with updates as they evolve. The position was announced with the flexibility of the 30- or 40-hour position.

Division 6 NRC

As soon as the Division 3 NRC is filled, we will start the process to fill this position with the remaining 30- or 40-hour position.

DISTRICT TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROCESS

With the funding of WQPA this year, we are going to have to adjust our technical assistance allocation process and available hours. Our focus and priority this year is going to be on WPQA project proposals and project implementation which I feel Districts will agree is mutually beneficial as in most cases they are the project sponsors.

I am in the process of working through the requests and to date I don't see any areas where the reduced number of hours available to Districts for technical assistance on non-WQPA projects will cause concern. After the Emmett NRC position is filled, I will know how many hours I have available in Divisions 3 and 6. I will send the engineering requests to Bill L. for review so that he can allocate the engineering hours.

FINANCIAL SPECIALIST VACANCY

After Rachel announced she was leaving the Commission to take a position with another agency, DHR suggested we consider reclassifying our Financial Specialist, Senior position to a Financial Specialist, Principal. Crystal took on the task of pulling together and presenting the documents required to request the reclassification and worked closely with DHR and DFM to develop an accurate description of the responsibilities, duties, and functions we require our Financial Specialist to fulfill. Prior to us announcing the position, DHR and DFM determined the reclassification was justified and approved it on May 25th.

My primary motivation for pursuing the reclassification was to improve our chances of attracting—and especially of retaining—a highly qualified Financial Specialist. The reclassification moves this position up one pay grade and gives us opportunity to offer a significantly higher salary than what we have provided previous Financial Specialists.

As of June 9th, the announcement has closed and three strong applicants have passed the Subject Matter Expert review, and Crystal is working to schedule interviews. Further developments will be relayed during your June 15th meeting.

AG SUMMIT CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The Larry Branen Idaho Ag Summit Committee is soliciting nominations for the Governor's Awards for Excellence in Agriculture. The attached *Ag Summit Call for Nominations* provides information about the awards and a nomination form. Nominations must be submitted by July 1.

WATER QUALITY PROGRAM FOR AGRICULTURE (WQPA) UPDATE

Since your April meeting when you considered the 18 WQPA proposals received through April 19th, we have received an additional 72 proposals, bringing to 90 the total number of proposals received to date. In brief, 32 Conservation Districts and 6 other entities applied to sponsor implementation projects. In total, \$12M of WQPA funding has been requested to assist with projects the total cost of which is \$30.7M.

You will consider the 70 new proposals later in this meeting, but I want to take this opportunity to say a huge thank-you to our field staff and to the District supervisors and staff who have put so much time and energy into developing these proposals.

The awards are not limited to agriculture producers. For example, a nominee for the Education and/or Advocacy category could be a local agriculture reporter or someone on a chamber of commerce agriculture committee. The purpose of each award is to recognize outstanding individuals who impact agriculture in a positive way.

This is a wonderful opportunity for honorees to be recognized by their peers and state leaders for their contributions to agriculture and Idaho. Please take the time to consider nominating someone you know that should be recognized for his or her important contribution to agriculture.

Category Descriptions

Education and/or Advocacy: A person in any profession who is committed to educating Idaho citizens about the importance of agriculture and the agricultural industry to their life, culture, and economy. An advocate is one who is devoted to promoting agriculture to the public, government, and other decision makers at the local, state and/or national level. Education and/or Advocacy may be presented as one or separate awards; however, only one award may be presented in this category each year.

Environmental Stewardship: An individual or agri-business that demonstrates a commitment to maintaining and improving the quality of the air, water or soil as a result of innovative practices, technologies and/or partnerships.

Marketing Innovation: A grower, shipper, processor, or commodity group that demonstrates excellence and effectiveness of individual programs conducted to develop or increase sales of Idaho food or agriculture products, internationally or domestically. This may include development and use of new markets, new marketing methods or new uses for products and/or services.

Technical Innovation: An individual or agri-business that develops or implements new methods or mechanisms to advance agricultural production or processing.

Lifetime Achievement: An individual who has dedicated his or her life to the advancement of agriculture through production, innovation, improvement, leadership, service and/or advocacy and who embodies the high standards of Idaho agriculture and sets an example for others to follow.

ISWCC Board of Supervisors:

The Portneuf Soil and Water Conservation District (PSWCD) Board of Supervisors have a concern about the way funds for sponsored projects are currently designed to be processed. The boards concern is that the projects are being awarded in early summer 2022 but funding isn't available until July 2022, and the project must be completed by June of 2023. Our understanding is that even if the project is approved but not completed within this time frame then funds may be returned to the state because that hadn't been spent yet even though they were committed. Due to the thriving economy and the lack of available contractors, and also the challenge of supplies and availability, the board would like to offer this solution for consideration and would ask the commissioners to research the possibility of moving in this direction. It would be very unfortunate to see money have to be sent back due to circumstances outside of our control.

To solve this issue, PSWCD requests that ISWCC send the awarded funds of sponsored projects to the specific sponsor to manage and administer in cooperation with ISWCC. This would code the funds as spent on ISWCC's books and potentially give the sponsor enough time to schedule their project with a contractor.

Acknowledging this violation, the Commission now states its intent to cure this violation.

Pursuant to Idaho Code section 74-208(1), the actions taken regarding WQPA Applications 22001, 22002, 22006, 22007, and 22008 are hereby declared void.

Now that the violation has been cured, the Commission will reconsider the applications in open meeting.

PROCESS TO BE FOLLOWED

Staff will lead your Board through a spreadsheet containing data related to each of 73 WQPA proposals. Included is proposal WP 22012 which you reviewed in April but didn't act on pending receipt of additional information from the project sponsor, and the 72 new proposals received since April, WP 22019 – WP 22090.

As we go through the spreadsheet feel free to ask any question at any time. Representatives of sponsors are welcome to provide additional project details.

Many proposals include information exempt from disclosure. After you have completed your review of the materials subject to disclosure, you will move into executive session to review the exempt materials.

Staff have developed for your consideration recommendations relative to each WQPA proposal. The recommendations are based on:

- A desire for WQPA to benefit Idaho's water resources in the manner intended by the 2022 legislature when they appropriated funds to the program.
- Sponsor's prioritization, in cases where they submitted more than one proposal.
- A desire for WQPA to benefit as many Conservation Districts as possible.

Staff developed a template (see attached WQPA PROPOSAL RATING TEMPLATE) which we used to arrive at a numerical rating for each project.
