South Caribou Water Quality Project

This project is ongoing, and we were just granted an extension until March 2024. We are finishing up currently and are waiting on a permit in order to finish. Once we have that, we will be able to finish up and write the final report.

North Caribou Irrigation Enhancement State BMP Project

This project involves 3 landowners. It includes a pivot instillation, cover crops, and a livestock water improvement. So far the pivots are installed, and we are working on the stock water. It will be finished soon.

Mathews Irrigation and Stock Water

This is a new project this year. The focus is on sprinkler to pivot conversion, a livestock watering project including solar pumping and spring development. So far the pivot has been installed.

Ledges Irrigation and Livestock Watering/WQPA

This is a new project this year. There is a ditch to pipe conversion, a new diversion, fencing an cross fencing, solar pump and watering system. This project involves three landowners. Our WQPA project is providing match money on this project.

Jorgensen, Laghter, Reeder Irrigation & Livestock

This is a new project this year. There is steel mainline replacement, spring development with solar pumping stations as well as floating pumping base directly on the Bear River.

Caribou Stream Stabilization and Livestock Watering

This is a new project for this year and is a 3 year 319 project. This project will focus on riparian fencing to reduce livestock impacts. There will be stock water systems, diversion structure and pipeline installation. There will also be a Bever Dam Analog installed on a tributary of the Blackfoot river.

District Capacity Building Funds

The Caribou SCD used the capacity building funds to help the city of Soda Springs with their Arbor Day program. We hosted a project tour/lunch this year(pictured below) It also purchased office supplies and equipment. As well as district expenses for 3 supervisors and the administrative assistant to attend conference this year.
