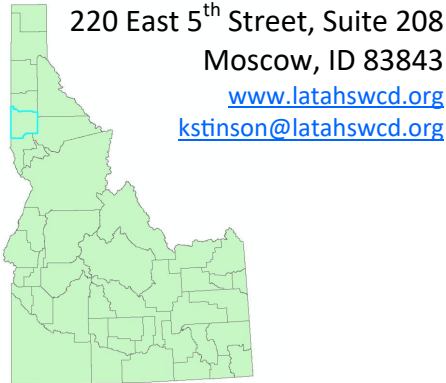

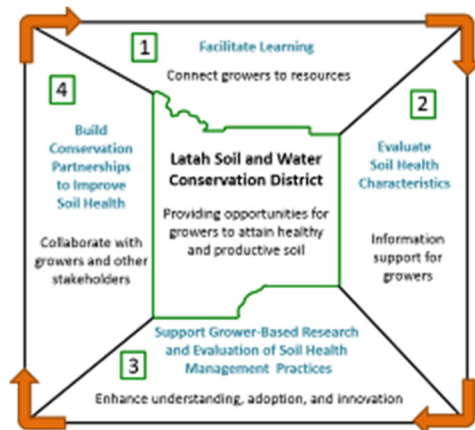
Mission Statement

In FY23, Latah SWCD continued to provide assistance to the Idaho Association of Soil Conservation District and the University of Idaho with the USDA grant designed to address agricultural practices and climate change across the State of Idaho.



In FY23, Latah SWCD continued to expand capacity to undertake aerial flights to monitor restoration sites. Aerial monitoring has assisted private and public land managers and provided additional tools for effectiveness monitoring of restoration projects.

In FY23, several public and private entities worked with the Latah SWCD to undertake large meadow restoration projects to enhance wild steelhead habitat within the Potlatch River watershed. Funding was secured by Latah SWCD through the Bonneville Power Administration, Idaho Department of Environmental Quality, Idaho Office of Species Conservation, and Idaho Soil & Water Conservation Commission.



FY 2023 Accomplishments

- Cumulatively, over 400 acres and 13 miles of stream have been enhanced with meadow restoration projects implemented throughout the Potlatch River basin.
- Latah SWCD planning staff and field crews continue to lead on-the-ground restoration work on private, state and federal lands in collaboration with landowners and agency partners
- The District formed and coordinated the Latah County Partnership to expand coordinated restoration funding and services across Latah County.
- Palouse Prairie restoration projects continue to expand on private lands throughout Latah County.
