## **2023 District Accomplishments**

- Annual Soil Health Symposium: Over 120 people attended the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual 2023 Soil Health Symposium organized by Payette SWCD and partners Ada SWCD, Adams SWCD, Bruneau River SCD, Oregon State University, University of Idaho, and USDA NRCS. Featured speakers presented soil health topics, 2 local producer panels shared their experiences implementing soil health practices, and the "Climate Smart" Commodities Grant Program was introduced by U of I and OSU.
- Lower Payette River, Mid-Snake Hells Canyon, and Little Willow Creek TMDLs: One Federal 319 grant, one State Ag 319 grant, and one WQPA grant projects, that replaced surface irrigated ag lands with center pivots, were completed in 2023. The district facilitated IDEQ with a tour of the completed Federal 319 grant project in the Little Willow Creek watershed. An additional WQPA grant project was awarded to the district that will be completed in 2024. With continued assistance from ISWCC staff, the district applied for another Federal 319 grant to convert surface irrigated acreage to center pivot irrigation.
- Outreach and Education: Maintained district website <a href="www.payetteswcd.org">www.payetteswcd.org</a> District supervisors attended and provided input to USDA NRCS in a virtual Local Working Group meeting to identify local natural resource priorities for the federal agency. The district provided an educational display at the Payette County Fair in August. District supervisors updated their board on Payette County Planning & Zoning issues as related to local agriculture and natural resources.
- District Operations: The district maintained an independent, viable district office to provide
  efficient and effective service to the public. Supervisors attended IASCD Division III meetings,
  reviewed and approved their 5-Year Plan, and completed required district reports. The district
  hired and trained a new Administrative Assistant, and appointed a new supervisor to fill one
  vacancy.
