Caribou Stream Stabilization and Livestock Watering

This is an ongoing 3 year 319 project. This project will focus on riparian fencing to reduce livestock impacts. There will be stock water systems, diversion structure and pipeline installation. There will also be a Beaver Dam Analog installed on a tributary of the Blackfoot river. This project is coming along well.

District Capacity Building Funds

The Caribou SCD used the capacity building funds to help the city of Soda Springs with their Arbor Day program. We hosted a project tour/lunch this year(pictured below) It also purchased office supplies and equipment. As well as district expenses for 3 supervisors and the administrative assistant to attend conference this year.
