Recent Activities


- ❖ CCD hosted and participated in the District 26 Legislative Luncheon.

- ❖ 29 well depth measurements were taken five times during 2019.
- ❖ CCD participated in the NRCS snow survey during the winter of 2018-2019
- ❖ The Chairman and the new administrative assistant were present at the IASCD conference in Boise.
- ❖ Administrator and a supervisor attended Legislative Display Day at the Capitol with three other administrators from district IV.
- ❖ Vice Chair McGough and new administrative assistant attended the Division IV meeting. Camas County High School speech contestant, Ashly Botz, gave her speech on this year's topic: "Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper."

- ❖ Our sixth Arbor Day Open House invited Camas elementary schools to participate in an Arbor Day work shop about trees. Forest service tree specialist John Pine brought different species of trees native to Fairfield for the students to see, touch, smell, and learn about. 70 Seedlings and tree-related information were handed out to the school kids and interested individuals. Everyone who visited was entered into a drawing for a tree. Volunteers participated and three agencies were represented (USFS, City of Fairfield, and CCD)
